MedEdAfrica 2025 Conference **in Kigali Rwanda**  Hosted by the University of Global Health Equity in partnership with the Rwanda Ministry of Health, this inaugural event convened over 750 participants from 46 countries including

policymakers, students, researchers, and representatives from 115 African medical school to shape a shared vision for the future of medical education on the continent.

#### Major Activities and Progress on the Two-Year Plan

Looking ahead, COMS-A has developed and adopted its first Annual Plan, a key step toward operationalizing our collective

vision. This plan outlines priority activities designed to advance health professions education and strengthen the delivery of medical care across the continent. We are already making steady progress toward this year's goals:

#### **Major Activities**

- 1. Establish its Secretariat, operational staff, and infrastructure
- 2. Strengthen partnerships with existing platforms in Africa such as AfreHealth, ACHEST, CONSAMS, and others.
- 3. Plan for the MedEd Africa 2026 Annual Conference
- 4. Conduct a continental survey of African Medical Schools
- 5. Membership expansion to at least 200 medical schools
- 6. Establish Africa's Women Leadership in Medical Education Forum and mentorship program
- 7. Support the Curriculum harmonization process that is being led by WHO AFRO
- 8. Prepare to launch a Faculty Development academy in English and French
- Prepare to launch the Higher Education Leadership Academy
- 10. Hold scientific forums and working groups
- 11. Establishment of a continental digital data-sharing platform on medical education metrics
- 12. Develop shared digital learning and resource-sharing systems
- 13. Launch a student and faculty exchange structure among member medical schools.

#### **Progress on the Two-Year Plan**



Plan and Host the MedEd Africa 2026 Annual Conference



Expand Membership to At Least 200 Institutions by End of 2025

The draft concept note for MedEd Africa 2026 has been prepared and will soon be finalized. Once-complete, it will be shared with member institutions to invite expressions of interest to host the next medical education conference.



Conduct a Continental Survey of African Medical Schools

We have successfully gathered a significant amount of data from 120 member institutions, covering areas such as Number of medical students enrolled by the medical school, Duration of undergraduate medical training, Availability of specialty programs and accreditation status by regional bodies. This data will inform future strategies and help shape a unified approach to medical education reform and easy partnerships among member institutions.

To date, COMS-A has grown to 133 member institutions, with 106 institutions having officially signed the COMS-A Constitution. The remaining 27 institutions are in the process of completing the necessary requirements, reflecting steady progress toward our goal of 200 members by the end of 2025.



Support the Curriculum Harmonization Process Led by WHO AFRO

The COMS-A Education Committee is actively collaborating with WHO AFRO to support the development of a harmonized curriculum framework tailored to the African context.





Develop a Continental Digital Data-Sharing Platform

We have collected critical institutional data across 120 members from both Founding members and New members, laying the groundwork for a platform that will enable access to real-time medical education metrics across the continent.



Hold Scientific Forums and Thematic Working Groups

Initial conversations around thematic subcommittees and scientific collaboration are in motion, with more updates to follow in the next quarter.



Create Shared Digital Learning and Open-Access Resource Systems

Plans are in development to explore platforms for resource-sharing and digital learning across member schools.



Launch the Higher Education Leadership Academy

COMS-A is partnering with the Africa Association for Public Health Leadership (AAPL) to co-design a leadership training program specifically for Deans and academic leaders.



Establish a Faculty and Student Exchange Program

This remains a key goal for enhancing cross-institutional collaboration and learning. A framework will be developed as part of the next implementation phase.

#### **Proposals Submitted to Donors**

We have submitted strategic proposals to key donors and partners to support these activities and will share updates as conversations progress.
